
## Sport and P.E.

In **Sporting** news, our learners have been really enjoying having a hit of tennis. The COLA is the perfect location for a friendly match between our learners, and whilst there has been many hits (and misses!) there has also been many giggles along the way.

Very soon we begin our swimming program- starting Wednesday 30 November, we will swim on Wed, Thurs and Fri afternoons for two weeks, finishing on Friday 9 December.

## Numeracy

In **Mathematics** our junior learners are focusing on their addition, subtraction, division and multiplication skills. And our senior learners are working out percentage calculations and making comparisons between decimal fractions, fractions and percentage. They are working it out almost 100% of the time!



## Literacy and Inquiry

Our **Literacy** work for this term will focus on article writing – using Who, What, When, Where and Why – our learners have become budding reporters. They have written up the recent Science Excursion to the Science Discovery Centre as an article. It certainly appears that we have some future journalists amongst us. Great work!



## Inquiry

Our **Inquiry** unit this term, a Scientific one – ‘Does Everything Matter?’ has now finished for the term and we ended it with a fantastic excursion to the Science Discovery Centre in Bendigo. We all had a fantastic time – thank you to the teachers and staff for coming along. The day was filled to the brim with hands on learning activities. ## Rhyme Awareness

Rhyme awareness is another early phonological awareness skill which builds emergent literacy skills. Rhyming requires children to listen closely for sounds within words. Children who recognise rhyme realise that words are made up of separate parts. Rhyming words are words which have the same ending sound, regardless of spelling.
