# Inquiry

Over the past few weeks we have been working on our Inquiry unit -Me! What am I worth? We have looked into oral hygiene and how to be a germ buster. It's been really good and we have learnt a lot along the way. Inquiry now has us investigating what is beautiful and what beautiful means. We look at what the media displays and we look at our understanding that we are all created in the image and likeness of God.
