Literacy

In Literacy we are creating Poetry. The students are looking at and practicing with rhyming words. All the learners have had a bit of a go at composing short rhyming poems and are doing a great job so far.

Numeracy

In Numeracy, the new topic is Chance and Probability. We are learning to understand that there are things that will happen, won't happen and might happen. We are learning to talk about everyday events that involve chance and use the classifications 'likely', 'certain' and 'impossible'.
