Dear Families,

Hopefully you all received your invitation last week to our end of year Mass and Celebration. This is a very important event in the life of our school as it gives us the opportunity to come together as a community and give thanks for another wonderful year. During the Mass we will also farewell our teachers that are leaving as well as our Graduating students. Jores, Lily and Reece have been fantastic leaders this year and our Mass will be an opportunity to hear their reflections about their time at St. Pat's, and for us to officially recognise the contribution they have made to our school community.

Advent starts on Sunday 3rd of December and marks the beginning of the Liturgical year. In our Catholic tradition, the liturgical year goes through a 3-year cycle. In year A, Sunday Gospels focus on the writings of Matthew, in Year B we hear predominantly from Mark's Gospel and in Year C we hear the stories of Jesus' life from the viewpoint of St. Luke. The Gospel according to John is dotted throughout the 3-year cycle. This means that over 3 years, we hear the complete story from all four Gospels. As Advent approaches and we move towards Year B and Mark's Gospel, we reflect on the image of Jesus that Matthew depicted in his writings. He showed Jesus as both the Son of God and also as very much human. He emphasised that Jesus was a teacher by adding many of the sayings and sermons of Jesus, and he held the view that Christian life should always be filled with a sense of expectation. Advent is a time of expectation, a time of waiting, a time to look forward and a time to prepare for the birth of the Saviour.

We have all seen the devastating footage of the current conflict in the Middle East. There's not much we can do from here, but we can pray. Please find attached to today's Newsletter a Prayer Card for you and your family.

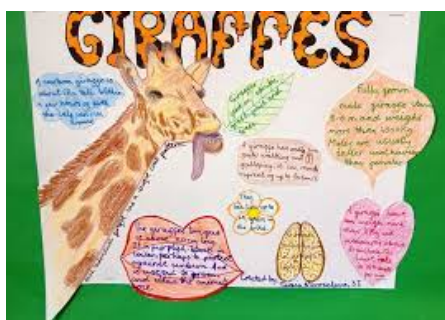
