Welcome to Term 4! It was wonderful to welcome our Learners back to school. As you would have read in our Term 4 Curriculum Newsletter, the term is filled with exciting learning and opportunities.

Thank you for your kind words congratulating me on my appointment to Catholic Education Sandhurst in 2022. My long journey and commitment to St Patrick's Primary School and community has been a significant and valued part of my life and one that I will treasure. Staff and the School Advisory Board have met with Principal Consultant, Ashley Marsh for discernment as the Principal position has been advertised and closes on Monday 25th October.

Our combined Spirituality Day with St Mary's Cohuna and St Joseph's Kerang has been cancelled due to current restrictions. Learners will also participate in three rotations to support the day of learning. A liturgy will begin our day at 9.00am.

The Bendigo Cup Fashions on the Field will be held at school on Wednesday 27th October which is now a strong tradition at St Patrick's. Learners and staff are asked to come dressed in their 'finery' as judges, Michael and Louise, will choose the best dressed male and female, the best millinery, best footwear and the best 'strut on the catwalk'.

Bike Education commences next week on Wednesday. Our Learners have been excited to let us know that their bikes are ready with inflated tyres and a well fitting helmet. Literacy

We are learning to explore ways that language can express emotions, experiences and points of view.

Our Junior Learners have been exploring Nursery Rhymes and identifying rhyming words within a text. Learners are now starting to utilise their understanding to write their own Rhyme about Pyramid Hill.

Senior Learners have begun exploring songs by investigating the structure including verses, the chorus and the bridge. Learners are beginning to unpack the meaning behind the lyrics of songs and utilise these understandings to write their own song!

Inquiry Unit

Our F-2 learners have been exploring the purpose of Lyrics and Instruments. Learners are now able to identify the purpose of both of these musical components as well as the ability to identify a range of instruments used to express emotion and feelings.

The Senior Learners have explored different ways of creating music through instruments and technologies which contain a message. This fortnight, Learners will begin creating their own TV show opener which will include visuals and music with lyrics. We look forward to seeing the outcome of their creativity!

Music

Our Learners in Music have been focusing on the C and F chords on a Ukulele. Our Foundation - Grade 2 Learners have been practicing 'You Are my Sunshine' and the Grades 3 - 5 Learners have been focusing on 'Silent Night' in preparation for our end of year Mass!

Mathematics

Operations! Not the board game but addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. This has been the topic of focus for the last fortnight.

The Junior Learners have been investigating addition and subtraction by developing their understanding of strategies including: partitioning, algorithm, friends of 10, counting on and counting back. Ask your Learners to demonstrate their strategies for you at home!

The Senior learners have been investigating Multiplication and Division. Learners have been developing strategies for basic multiplication facts focusing on our times tables as this also links with Division as well. Ask your learners to play "Pacman" with you at home to test their developing understanding of their times tables!

Respectful Relationships

Problem solving skills are such an important life skill to develop whether we are an infant, child, adolescent or adult. Learners are focusing on different areas of these skills depending on their current skills.

Junior Learners explored the impact their choices have on other peoples feelings and then related this to a story.

Senior Learners undertook problem solving activities to build on their understanding that there are many possible solutions to problems and it is important that we use all of our knowledge to make an informed decision about which solution may be best.

CHILDREN'S CHATTER MATTERS!

Focus: Word associations

One player starts by saying a word. The next player says a word that is related to the first word. It can be related in any way. If another player cannot see how the words are related, he/she can challenge, and the connection needs to be explained. Keep going until a word is repeated or a connection cannot be explained. Here's an example: Egypt – Mummy – Dad – beard – Santa Claus – Christmas – trees – leaves.
