Also on Tuesday, we will be having a short liturgy for the "Burning of the Palms" to make our ashes for Wednesday. Our Ash Wednesday Mass will take place at 2:30 at school and there will be a Parish Mass in the Church at 6:00pm.

As you are aware, Ash Wednesday begins our Season of Lent. During Lent, in schools across the country, we turn our attention to Caritas and Project Compassion. This year's Project Compassion theme is "For All Future Generations". This reminds us that the good we do today will extend and impact the lives of generations to come. We will, as in past years, be holding mini fundraising events each week during Lent to do our little bit to raise funds to support Caritas. Shrove Tuesday

Shrove Tuesday is an ancient Christian festival and is the day before Lent begins. In some countries it is called Mardi Gras. which means 'fat Tuesday'. In Italy it is called Carnevale, which means the removal of meat. It is the last day for having good times before the serious time of Lent begins.

The word *shrove* is an old word meaning to confess, or tell a secret. Christians traditionally went to church to confess bad things they had done, so they were forgiven before Lent.

In the days before fridges and freezers, people had to use up the food they were not allowed to eat during Lent rather than let it go bad. So on the day before Lent, they used up all the eggs, milk, butter and cream by making pancakes, cakes or pastries.

Ash Wednesday then started the time of fasting, prayer and giving to the poor. The Church stills asks us to do this during Lent as we prepare for Easter and the resurrection of lesus.

In the next fortnight we will shift our focus to persuasive writing but in the meantime let's let our creative narrative writing send us out of this world.




Inquiry Unit

F-2 Length
