




## Inquiry Unit

## Numeracy

## Literacy

We will continue with our Language and Punctuation skills, spelling and handwriting. These are small group activities that rotate each day and the learners are becoming very familiar with our routine.

Our writing focus will see us revise Narrative and Persuasive writing. This will support our learners who will be participating in the NAPLAN testing during week 3.



## R.E.

Our first Unit for this term will be focused on Prayer. We will look at what prayer is, different types of prayer and different ways to pray. The learners will also discuss how prayer deepens their relationship with God.

For Catholic Education Week, the students investigated where we fit into the wider Church community including the different diocese in Australia focusing on our Diocese of Sandhurst.

## 5/6 Leadership


### Conference
