### Literacy

Save the date: 25th August! Our Learners will be celebrating their hard work in writing by presenting their Persuasive speeches to a select few members of the Lion's Club organisation!

Grades 3 - 5 this fortnight have developed whole group Success Criteria for their speech writing and used this as a checklist to assess their writing. We are well on the way!

Grades F - 2 have been focusing on identifying punctuation throughout a text as we read, as well as looking at the author's purpose and intention. This has helped us to write our Persuasive Writing texts about Reusing and Recycling!

### **Inquiry Unit**

How sustainable is sustainability? This is the question that the Grades Foundation - 2 Learners have investigated this fortnight. In thinking about how much rubbish we put in the bin, we asked ourselves what are our other options? Upcycling was one answer! A big thank you to the families that contributed their recyclables for our Learners to make new creations.

Learners from Grades 3 - 5 have been focusing on Renewable and Nonrenewable resources and researching the cause and effect humans can have on our environment and then creating their own presentation.



### Music

Foundation - 2 Learners in music lessons have been discovering High, Low and in the Middle sounds. Learners discovered that we can not only do this with our voices but also with a range of Instruments as well!


Our Grades 3 - 5 Learners have been learning what Mime is and how we can express emotions without the sound of our voice through body language and movements.

### **Mathematics**

Megalitres? Kilolitres? Litres? Millilitres? The Grade 3 - 5 Learners are investigating the difference between these units of capacity and beginning to understand how to convert between them! Ask these Learners at home to tell you what they know about the units of capacity and what real life examples would it be appropriate to measure with these units?

#### What is Volume?

Learners from F - 2 have been very busy investigating and finding the amount of space inside a solid figure. Learners created their own shapes using the MAB blocks to help us investigate what Volume looks like (Volume isn't just the sound of your noise level as we discovered!) We also looked at the units of measurement with volume which includes the Length, Width and Height.



### Respectful Relationships

Junior Learners read the text 'All Kinds of Fears' and identified similarities between themselves and the character in the text. They explained what fears they had and how they cope with them.

Senior Learners are exploring how emotional responses vary in depth and strength by using a visual of a thermometer. High intensity emotions are found at the top of the thermometer and low intensity emotions are at the bottom. Learners brainstormed experiences that they may have had at different stages of the thermometer.

### SOFT PLASTICS COLLECTION POINT AT ST PATRICK'S



#### You can recycle:

- Plastic shopping bags
- Bread, rice, pasta, lolly and cereal bags
- Biscuit packs (but not the trays)
- Frozen food bags
- Bubble wrap
- Fruit and veg bags and netting
- Toilet paper packaging and similar product packaging
- Old green bags (and other re-usable bags

Please make sure your plastic is dry and as empty as possible.

### **CHILDREN'S CHATTER MATTERS!**

#### Focus: Syllables

As you read with your child, practice breaking words up into syllables (beats in a word). For example, chick-en (chicken) has two syllables and el-e-phant (elephant) has 3 syllables. Clapping out the word into syllables can help. Talk about how longer words have more syllables. Ask your child to think of the longest words they know. Demonstrate the length by clapping out the beats or syllables – caterpillar (cat-er-pill-ar has 4 claps), encyclopedia (en-cy-clo-pe-di-a has 6 claps).


#### Success criteria:

On **Monday 9th August** all staff participated in our second whole of school staff Professional learning day to support our 'Visible learning' journey.

Already we have a strong focus on sharing the **Learning Intention** with our Learners to ensure that they understand what it is they are learning. To support this understanding, please ask them at home, what have you been learning in Maths today? What have you been learning in Religious Education? Their answers must relate to what they have been learning, not what they have been doing.

Our Learners assess their understanding at the end of each lesson to assess their individual success, using **Success Criteria.** Our Learners are given the criteria to allow them to know what they need to be able to do to have success.

This has been supportive learning for all staff as we implement these initiatives to ensure that the **learning is visible** at St Patrick's.
