This week we have been celebrating NAIDOC Week. NAIDOC stands for National Aborigines and Islanders Dav Observance Committee. Not many people are aware that the origins of NAIDOC Week can be traced back to the 1920's when a number of indigenous communities sought to increase awareness in the wider community of the status and treatment of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Australians. The aim is to celebrate the history, culture and achievements of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples. NAIDOC Week is celebrated by all Australians and is a great opportunity to learn more about Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander communities.

We have a number of exciting events happening this term. On Monday 1st August our Year 5 and 6 students will be travelling to Bendigo for the Ablaze Festival. This festival, hosted by Fr. Rob Galea, celebrates our Catholic Faith and will be attended by most schools in our part of the Diocese. On the 29th August, the whole school will be heading over to Echuca to perform in the Sandhurst Arts on Show Spectacular. # **Chaplain's Chat**

Anxiety is a word that is often spoken about, let's get a clear definition of anxiety: Intense. excessive persistent worry and fear about everyday situations. Fast heart rate, rapid breathing, **sweating** feeling tired may occur. What you is may surprise this statement:

"Anxiety can be **normal** in stressful situations such as public speaking or taking a test."

Anxiety is only an indicator of underlying illness when feelings become excessive and interfere with daily living. It's very important not to confuse the two. If we feel our child is being anxious it's very important to reassure your child rather than just brush it off. Letting them know that you are with them and they will be ok. Listen to them and be empathic, help them to understand what they are anxious about.

The message you want to send is,

"I know you're scared, and that's okay, and I'm here, and I'm going to help you get through this."
