Dear Families,

What an interesting start to the term we've had! The most important thing though, is that everyone in our community is safe. At the same time, we remain aware that many people in the Pyramid Hill community and beyond have been hugely impacted by the recent floods and we keep them in our thoughts and prayers.

For those in our school communities who have been impacted by the flood waters, the Victorian Government has announced a grants program to help all flood-impacted schools and students in the recovery process. If your home or belongings have been damaged by the current floods, you will be able to access support up to the value of \$1200 for each student. This money is to provide assistance in replacing essential school items such as uniforms, school shoes and stationery, and digital items such as USBs and headphones. Please see the attached letter for more information and the complete list.

One of the many associated problems with the recent floods is the increase in mosquito breeding. Mosquitoes carry a number of diseases so it is important that we protect ourselves from them. Mosquitoes do not breed in the initial flood waters, they breed in the warm stagnant water after flood water recedes. Please read inside this newsletter for some simple precautions to help protect you and your families.

During the recent time of Remote Learning, we were unable to hold our Term 4 Parent Engagement Forum. This has been re-scheduled to next Monday, 14th of November at 5pm. This is an important meeting as we will be discussing School Fees for 2023 and throwing around some ideas about school renovations. Everyone is welcome to attend.

Our seniors are writing up practical reports based on the Science experiments that they are completing. They are being introduced to new words such as rationale and hypothesis.

We are continuing to read our class novels – Matilda by Roald Dahl and The Secret Garden by Frances Hodgson Burnett. These lovely stories are being thoroughly enjoyed by our reading groups.

Our Inquiry unit this term is a Scientific one – ‘Does Everything Matter?’

We have been having a great time making gas – that is we have been considering all things to do with states of matter – solids, liquids and gas.

## Syllable Counting

Syllable awareness is an early phonological awareness skill which forms the foundation for emergent literacy skills. Syllable awareness is the skill of hearing the sounds within words and recognising that words can be broken into syllables or word parts. Listening to compound words (e.g. classroom) and breaking them up into their word parts is a great way to start. The skill requires counting, tapping, blending (e.g. kan-ga-roo = kangaroo) or segmenting words into their word parts.

## Mosquitoes

**Here are some of the most effective and simple ways to avoid mosquito bites:**

- Be aware that mosquitoes are most active around dusk and dawn.
- If mozzies are about, seek shelter and keep windows and fly screens shut.
- Cover up - try to wear long and loose fitting clothes and avoid dark clothing.
- Avoid perfumes and colognes.
- Use a repellent containing Picaridin or DEET 15 - 20%
