Literacy


In Literacy we are writing narratives again, this time using interesting prompts to get our creative juices flowing.

Our last 2 Caritas Fundraisers are coming up. The first one this Thursday after Gymnastics and then next week at the PH College Fete.


30th March: The children will watch a movie and enjoy some popcorn after we get back from Gymnastics. Gold Coin donation.
