


Literacy

It lessens anxiety and stress, participating in Basketball Clinics increases resilience empowers children to cope and manage difficult situations. While some situations produce big emotions, this program uses the science of the brain, meditations and problem solving to develop emotional intelligence. We run this program once a week and the children get to share these at home. As the program facilitator I value this life skill for our children and the impact it can make for them.
