




Chaplain's Chat

Welcome Back to School – Happy 2023

We are very excited to be back at school and are already busy working on projects and tasks in Literacy, Numeracy and Inquiry.

At the moment in Literacy we have started our literacy rotations again but this time we have changed things up a little. We still do guided reading, GLP and handwriting, but instead of spelling we are undertaking independent story writing. It's been really good and has our creative juices flowing!

We have also been focusing on recount/recall writing as well and the learners have been retelling stories that have been shared with them


In Numeracy we have split into two groups with one group focussed on skip counting and number patterns and the other on place value and large numbers. There have been lots of games and quizzes and it has been really fun.

Our Inquiry topic for this term is Me! What am I worth? This topic will have us examine who we are and why it is important to care for ourselves. We have been looking at our identities but will move onto body health and hygiene, self-esteem and body image and then personal safety, including digital safety. Onset and Rime

Onset and Rime is an early phonological awareness skill which helps children recognise common 'chunks' within words and patterns between words and word families. Onset and rime knowledge helps children decode new words when reading and form spelling strategies.
