

Dear Families,

Welcome to Term 2. I hope that each and every one of you found some time to rest, relax and recuperate after what was a very busy start to the year. This term promises to be just as busy and exciting with a number of events and activities scheduled throughout the next few months.

One of the first things happening this term is a change over of our digital platform. For many years, most schools in the Sandhurst Diocese have mainly relied on the Google suite of applications for educators and students. There will be a switch happening across the Diocese this year from Google to Microsoft 365. Our change-over will occur at the end of this week. We will be getting support from the Catholic Education Office to ensure that the change is a smooth process and that we have the knowledge and skills to help the students become efficient and effective users of the new technology. This change will also result in new devices for the students and staff when our current lease expires later in the year.

Another important process that we will engage in this term is a School Review. Every few years, schools undergo a review process to gauge what things are working well and what things could be improved upon. A three person panel will work with us for 3 days from May 14th to 16th. They will use the School Improvement Tool (SIT) developed by the Australian Council for Educational Research (ACER). In the next couple of weeks I will be inviting some parents to be part of this process.

Most of you would be familiar with SIMON. SIMON is our Learning and School Administration platform. It is used, among other things, for our roll marking, report configuring and generation, report writing and student information. There are other aspects of SIMON that we have not made use of yet that will be introduced throughout the next few months. The first of these is PAM. PAM stands for Parent Access Module and it allows for you to have consistent and updated information about how your child's academic progress is going. It also can be used for permission and excursion forms so that we can move away from our reliance on sending home hard copies. PAM can also be used for contacting the school if your child is ill or will be away from school. The other aspect of SIMON that we are looking at is SIMON Everywhere. This is an app based version of PAM that has all the features of PAM but can be used straight from your phone. We are hoping that the introduction of these extra features will improve our ability to communicate more effectively between school and home.

What's Happening in the Classroom?

Welcome to Week 1 of Term Two.

We have some new friends in our classroom this Term. The children will be super excited to name them. We will let you know once we have voted on the best names for our 'fintastic' new friends.



Literacy: F-6 This Term there will be a strong focus on spelling and writing. The senior students will be learning about the correct sentence structure and the importance of grammar and punctuation. The F-2 students will be exploring features of procedural texts and building on their letter sound knowledge. We will continue with our reading goals of reaching 50 and 75 nights of reading. The children will also receive their prize from the reading box when they complete their reading milestones.

Numeracy: F-2 students will be building on their understanding of place value through counting and grouping numbers. The 3-6 students will be working on addition and subtraction facts to develop their mental computation strategies.

Religion: Over the next two weeks we will learn about ANZAC DAY and commemorate the generations of sacrifice made by men, women and children who have died in the cause of liberty and peace.

Resilience, Rights and Respectful Relationships: Our topic for the next four weeks is 'Positive Coping'. The students will learn about ways to manage and take responsibility for intense emotions such as frustration and anger.

Inquiry: Physical Science- MAY THE FORCE BE WITH YOU!

Pushing and pulling, and floating and sinking - how are they related? In our Inquiry unit this term the students will learn about the forces of push and pull and how they work in our world.

YEAR F-2: What are the effects of force on the world around us?

YEAR 3-6: How forces impact our world?

Sport: Our topic for the next four weeks will be developing AFL footy skills.
