Literacy

Our 3/4 and 5/6 reading groups have continued to read the novel "Gangsta Granny" by David Walliams and the students are now moving towards the climax of the story. The learners are making predictions about what might happen next based on what they have read so far. All students are also busy researching and writing in preparation for the Lions Club Public Speaking Competition. The topic for our F-4 students is 'Oh no, you've turned into a giant' whilst the 5/6 learners are looking into strange world records set in history.



Inquiry

Our Inquiry topic continues to focus on Civics and Citizenship and what it means to live in a Democracy. Last week we looked at who the decision makers are in our community and now we move to the question of: What is democracy in Australia, how do we elect our leaders and why is voting important or needed in a democracy?



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Numeracy

The focus in Numeracy is now moving to Measurement with a particular focus on length. The students will be estimating the different lengths of various objects and comparing how long different objects are. The younger year levels will measure a variety of things using informal units of measurement (such as blocks or their hands) while the more senior students will be using more formal approaches to measurement.

We will look at formal prayers such as the Our Father and the Hail Mary, as well as silent prayer, individual prayer, meditation, prayers of intercession and the prayers of the Mass.

Help your child listen for the sounds

When looking at words, ask what sound (NOT letter) each word starts with... ? e.g. 'pot' starts with a /p/ sound. Can you think of more words that start with this sound? E.g. pin, pot, pig, play etc. What sound is at the end of.... ? e.g. 'pot' ends with a /t/ sound. Can you think of more words that end with this sound.
