



Dear Families,

Welcome to Term 3 and the second half of the year. I hope you all had an opportunity for some fun family time during the holidays.

First of all, thank-you to everyone who wished me a Happy Birthday for my big day during the holidays. I had a wonderful time away with Maree and a few other friends and your best wishes meant a lot to me.

Our Inquiry unit this term has a major focus on our First Nations people. We will start by looking at what life was like before European Colonisation and follow this up with the impact that colonisation had on our indigenous people. As part of this area of study, we will be having an excursion to the Yung Balug Aboriginal Artefacts Museum in Boort. Paul Haw, the founder and manager of the museum, will also take us for a walk around the Boort Lakes area to look at "scar trees" and other evidence of aboriginal life in the past. We will be joined on the day by three members of the Catholic Education Sandhurst Aboriginal Network Team. The excursion will take place on Friday 28th July. Please complete the permission form coming home today and return it to school as soon as possible. Also, I have been given the opportunity to attend an Aboriginal Immersion Trip to Lake Mungo. Lake Mungo, 115 kms north-east of Mildura, is a special and ancient place, rich in aboriginal history and protected as a World heritage site. I will be away at Mungo in week 4 of this term and Kerri will be overseeing things while I'm away.

As most of you would be aware, Leiza has been away for a few weeks after injuring herself in a fall. She will return to work on Friday 28th of July. Please keep her in your thoughts and prayers.

## Literacy

Our Literacy at the moment is very closely linked to our Inquiry topic and Indigenous perspectives. All students will be looking at various Dreamtime stories such as 'Tidalik the Frog'. These are stories that belong to the Indigenous people and they teach us a lesson or they explain something about creation. The students will look at the meaning behind the stories as well as the characters, events and settings which will help the students with their own writing.

In reading, the class will be discussing people of diverse backgrounds as they deepen their understanding of the history of Australia. Guided reading for the senior students will be looking at the book "Walking the Boundaries" whilst the middle students will focus on "After the High Tide".

## Numeracy

In Numeracy we are focusing on Multiplication and Division. Part of this work will be deepening the understanding of the relationship between these two mathematical concepts and the ideas of repeated addition and repeated subtraction.



## Inquiry

The new Inquiry topic for Term 3 asks the questions: **'What was Australia like before European Colonisation?'** and **'What impact did Colonisation have on our First Nations people?'**

The students started last week looking at "connection". What are they connected to, who are they connected to and do they feel connected to the land, were all questions that were covered.

This week the focus will shift to the history of Australia. Our First Nations people have been here for 60,000 years, and this will be a starting point of a complete timeline of Australia and what it may have been like before European Colonisation.



## R.E.

Our first topic for Religious Education in Term 3 will focus on the Bible. We will look at the make up of the Bible, including the Old Testament and the New Testament, the history of the Bible, some of the Authors of the Bible and the sacredness of the Bible.
