



We had a terrific day at Boort last Friday. The Yung Balug Aboriginal Museum was full of rare, interesting and fantastic artefacts and the children both enjoyed it and learnt a lot about Indigenous history and culture.

You may have noticed in last week's Newsletter that I was supposed to be away this week. A group of teachers from across the Diocese were meant to be going to Lake Mungo in south-western New South Wales. It would have been an awesome trip but unfortunately, due to heavy rain, all roads into the Lake Mungo area have been closed and the trip therefore, had to be cancelled.

One part of our Inquiry focus on Indigenous History and Culture has been to look at Aboriginal Art. Kerri and Bianca have done a number of lessons on different styles and methods and the learners have done a great job. A special part of our Art focus will happen in Week 6 of this term. Michellie Charvat works for the Australians Together Foundation. Living in Bendigo, she is a young Indigenous artist who will be joining us for 3 days on the 14th, 15th and 17th of August. She will be doing a number of activities with the students, culminating with a piece of art that all children will have contributed to, and which will be able to be displayed outside for all to see.

## Literacy

We have been very busy over the past few weeks with excursions, working in Literacy and investigating our Indigenous community. It is quite exciting.

In Literacy we have just finished off our Dreamtime Inspired Stories and they are fantastic. The care and attention to detail is work to be very proud of. Well done. Guided reading for the senior students will be looking at the book "Walking the Boundaries" whilst the middle students will focus on "After the High Tide".

## Numeracy

In Numeracy over the past few weeks we have delved into addition to multiplication with the juniors and the seniors have concentrated on division; some even mastering long division which is quite the challenge. We are now looking into directional and locational language in Maths and also angles and mapping. Lots of fun games and challenges have been tackled and everyone is doing their best.



## Inquiry

Inquiry has focused on our Indigenous Community of the Barapa Barapa. We have learnt about the long history of Aboriginal Australia, ancient cave paintings, Indigenous artworks and artefacts. Our excursion to Boort allowed us to get up close and personal with artefacts from our local community and to see the scar trees made by those communities living in the Boort Lake region many years ago. Everyone loved their learning experience and it has provided us with a greater understanding of the importance of recognition and reconciliation for peace, respect and country.



## R.E.

We continue to focus on the Bible in our R.E. lessons. After looking at the make-up of the Bible and the different books in it, we have now turned our attention to the Gospels and specifically the parables that Jesus told. Our first parable was the story of the Good Samaritan and this week we will look at the Prodigal Son.
